What We Do Every Day

Youngstown, Ohio

A female veteran came to us for immediate help. Her husband had been working in a foreign country, he has been detained from returning due to the perils of the time we live in. The veteran has become homeless due to this situation. She sought help from the VA through the HUD VASH program, and they have been able to find her permanent housing. She needed help with the fee for applying for utilities, she needed food and personal items. We were able to help her with all of those.



Youngstown. Ohio

An agency Caseworker brought our attention to a homeless veteran that was in line to get housing through HUD-VASH, which is a fantastic program administered through the VA. However, it doesn't happen immediately, and this leaves the veteran with an interim period of "What do I do until then, where can I go?" That's where we stepped in for this veteran, we provided a hotel stay until his new home was ready for him.

Grayson, Kentucky

Everyone you meet or talk to is an opportunity for giving. A gentleman donated to Veterans' Outreach brand new full and twin-size beds, box springs, mattresses, linens and pillows. The donation was valued at approximately \$1700.00. The veteran that received this donation was ecstatic, his needs had been met beyond what he ever thought was possible. The veteran, a former P.O.W. and Purple Heart Recipient, received the generous donation and the beds were delivered to him. He and his grandson had not slept in a bed for 4 years.

Heroes' Passage Update

Veterans' Outreach was donated 110 acres of Kentucky wilderness. Plans are underway to develop Heroes' Passage, a healing environment for post 9/11 veterans that are having problems with transitioning to civilian life. Plans include a working farm.



The Heroes' Passage project has partnered with the head of a local bee association. Our anonymous donor will be providing 10 Hives, the bees and the queen. In addition she is providing bee suits and the accessories needed for tending to the bees. She will be training Veterans' Outreach employees and volunteers on the bee keeping process. We are very grateful for her involvement in this project.

A Moment In History



Pearl Harbor

The Attack on Pearl Harbor was a surprise military strike by the Imperial Japanese Navy Air Service upon the United States against the naval base at Pearl Harbor in Honolulu, Territory of Hawaii, just before 08:00, on Sunday morning, December 7, 1941. The attack killed 2,403 service members and wounded 1,178 more, and sank or destroyed six U.S. ships,. They also destroyed 169 U.S. Navy and Army Air Corps planes. The Japanese losses included 29 aircraft, in addition to five midget submarines, and 129 attackers were killed and one taken prisoner.

Wreaths Across America coordinates wreath-laying ceremonies at more than 2,100 locations across the United States, at sea and abroad.

While coordinating wreath-laying ceremonies each December on National Wreaths Across America Day is a big part of what they do, the mission to Remember, Honor and Teach is carried out throughout the year.
